

Paul Spicer is well known as a recording artist and producer, composer, author, academic and, above all, choral conductor. He is widely acknowledged as one of the UK's leading exponents of British music. In addition to the Whitehall Choir, he also conducts the Finzi Singers, the Birmingham Bach Choir and the Chamber Choirs of the Birmingham Conservatoire, where he is Head of Choral Conducting.
