Paul Spicer began his musical training as a chorister at New College, Oxford. He studied with Herbert Howells and Richard Popplewell (organ) at the Royal College of Music in London, winning the Walford Davies Organ Prize in his final year. This is Paul's 12th season with Whitehall Choir; he also conducts the Birmingham Bach Choir and the chamber choirs at the Birmingham Conservatoire where, in addition to Oxford University, he teaches choral conducting. He founded the Finzi Singers in 1984 with whom he made 15 CDs for Chandos. Paul is in great demand, too, as a recording producer and as a composer. He recently finished a major biography and study of works of Sir George Dyson and is now at work on a commission for a choral symphony commemorating the centenary of the First World War.

James Longford studied piano and organ at the Royal College of Music, being awarded the Tagore Gold Medal, an RCM Junior Fellowship and Fellowship of the Royal College of Organists. He is the pianist for the Whitehall Choir as well as for the Royal Opera's Youth Opera Company, the London Concert Choir and Southbank Sinfonia orchestra. His wideranging freelance career as pianist and repetiteur includes companies such as the Royal Opera, English National Opera, English Touring Opera, the Opera Group, Gabrieli Consort and others. He is one half of the longfordbrown piano duo with New Zealand pianist Lindy Tennent-Brown.
